ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY



Thank you to everyone for their support for excellent attendance. As you know, this year attendance is tracked using a 10 in 10 method. 10 unauthorised absences (equivalent to 5 school days) will trigger us to consider a FPN. Miss Field, our Attendance Champion, is monitoring attendance every Tuesday and **may** contact you if we notice a drop in attendance. This is purely a supportive measure.

In school we are using a new registration system called Arbor. This system allows us to track the number of occasions pupils are late and the number of minutes of missed learning. Our school gates are open from 8:35am - 8:45am. Children who arrive after this time and arrive through the office are registered as late. If your child is late on 5 occasions or more you will be contacted by Miss Field as a supportive measure.
