The Summer Term is extremely busy with lots of events to look forward to. Please look at our forthcoming events section below and the list of key dates.


WORSHIP



This term our focus is Heart Priory; the celebration of spirituality and wellbeing. Nature plays a huge part in our health and wellbeing and therefore it is exciting that we will be taking part in the Diocesan project Triwonder - creation care. This project will inspire the children to look for creation and wonder in their environment. The dragonfly is the symbol for this project, a creature who transforms and lives at some point in the sea, on land and in the air. We will be exploring this



theme through art, science, sport and our Forest School sessions.



We have been looking at our vision picture again and in particular the tree made of three hearts in the centre. The tree reminds us of our own Spirituality Tree near the Astro which is currently out in beautiful, pink blossom. The three hearts represent ourselves, others, the World and Beyond. We retold the story of Samuel who heard God call his name 3 times and was ready to serve him. We reflected that we can take inspiration from Samuel to be looking for wonder around us.



Please take a moment to look at the creation and wonder around you and talk about this at home. Blossom or spring flowers might only last a few weeks so let's admire them whilst we have the chance.

GAMECHANGERS



We have celebrated pupils who have been taking part in key sports events, swimming and karate and those that have been using their creativity.

In preparation for our VE Celebrations next week, we watched a video clip of Winston Churchill announcing the end of WWII. We also learnt about Alan Francis who in 1945 was a newspaper boy and delivered the papers on VE day. He got to be a Gamechanger by giving all the people such good news. We looked at some newspaper headlines from 8th May 1945.

At Priory School, I encourage the children to embrace opportunities to support the local community and charity events. Earlier this term, our Year 6 pupils were invited to take part, along with other local schools, in a competition designing the poster for the Christchurch Rotary Wishing Well Walk taking place on Saturday 10th May. I am delighted to share that Evie got through to the final round for her striking design. We have looked at the Wishing Well Walk during our Gamechangers Worship and have learnt that the event supports Macmillan Caring Locally. School Event




