#### **ATTENDANCE**

#Teach & Learn Priory Progres

Maintaining regular school attendance is a key part of helping your child to flourish. We know that through regular attendance your child's learning journey will be well-sequenced and they will be able to continuously build on prior learning, helping them to make expected progress.

Each winter season, there are an increased number of bugs and viruses for us to contend with. We understand that there may be occasions when your child is too unwell to attend school. If your child is struggling to attend school for any other reason, please come and talk to us as we are here to help.

Attendance which falls below 90% is categorised as 'persistent absence'; your child's attendance will be monitored more closely and you may receive a phone call from one of our team. Leave of absence cannot be authorised except for exceptional reasons and therefore we ask that parents adhere to our term dates and do not request leave of absence in term time.

If you would like to discuss your child's attendance or to check their current percentage, please speak to the class teacher in the first instance.

We are pleased to offer a bespoke Phonics session for Class One parents on **Thursday 18th January at 2:30pm**. The session will be led by our English Lead, Miss Field, who will give parents an overview of our Little Wandle scheme and the progression of skills and knowledge through year one.
