Attendance

As a new school year begins, we want the best possible attendance for all pupils. The negative impact which poor school attendance has on a pupil's learning journey and subsequent progress can be profound, as well as being detrimental to social development. Of course, we understand that all children get ill from time to time and the guidance below from the Public Health Agency may be useful for parents in deciding whether time off school is needed.



Please note that a mild cough, cold or general tiredness are not valid reasons for absence and we urge you to send your child to school in these circumstances - this will help build their resilience. We will of course keep a careful eye on them and contact you should they not be managing.

Children often feel unwell if anxious - please talk to us if you feel that this may be the case and we will do everything we can to help.

Thank you for remembering that sickness / diarrhea does mean that your child will need to stay off school (until 48 hours after the last episode).
